

Year 3 - Helping your child at home



Homework

Children are given homework on a Thursday to be returned by the following Tuesday. This homework supports the learning that has taken place during the week in maths, literacy, reading or grammar lessons. Once homework has been marked, it will be returned to the children and can then be kept at home. If you or your child have any questions about a piece of homework, please speak to your child's teacher before it is due in. We expect all children to read a minimum of 3 times a week. We would like children to read 5 times a week to earn our 'Gold' award for reading.



Caught being gold

A reminder about the school's reward system – children can receive a "Caught being gold" raffle ticket for displaying one of our Golden Rules: honesty, kindness, respect, community and growth. Once a term, one child from each class is drawn in assembly and has the opportunity to go to a bookshop and have an ice cream.



Spellings

New spellings are given out on a Thursday, however, the rules and meanings are then taught throughout the week ready for the test on Friday. These words are challenging but follow the National Curriculum for Year 3.



Times Tables

On a Thursday, children will be given a new times table sheet to support them in learning their times tables ready for their test on the following Friday. The expectation for year 3 children is to know the times tables: x2, x5, x10, x3, x4 and x8 as well as the division facts.



PE

- Carousel day is on a Wednesday for Year 3. Children will need to wear their PE kits on this day.
- Year 3 will not be having an extra PE session after half term.



AtL

This year, as part of our marking policy, the school has introduced an AtL (Attitude to learning) mark if they are producing work below their capability. This may be due to poor quality, quantity or effort. E.g. not using full stops and capital letters when we know they can. When children have an AtL on their work, they are required to miss some of their break or lunch to correct or redo the work.
